


My Health Record

Check this first: Pathology reports, including blood test results, may not upload to your My Health Record. You may have to opt in first. If there are no pathology reports in your My Health Record, contact your preferred pathology lab and request they upload all pathology reports.

It may be easier to ask your doctor or reception to contact the lab and request the upload to your My Health Record.

- **Log in** or **Create** an account and follow the steps to set up My Health Record
- If you haven't set up My Health Record before, click on [View and link service](#) to link My Health Record to your MyGov.








